Over the Summer:

 Read books together! Reading aloud and having someone else read to you is important for developing your prereading/reading skills. Take advantage of your free membership to the Calgary Public Library and don't forget to register for their "Ultimate Summer Challenge"!



- **Play board games!** Chutes and Ladders, UNO, Guess Who and Zingo are a few of the many great board games that continue the learning with your family in a fun way!
- Discover words that rhyme! Rhyming pairs are everywhere! Do you notice rhyming words in a book? A song? The room that you are in?
- Explore in nature! Go outside and play, or be a nature detective! What do you notice when you visit different areas of our city and province? What animals do you see? What sounds do you hear?
- **Tell stories!** Fictional or non-fictional, story-telling is a great way to improve fluency and learn more about the world. Story-telling builds connection, empathy and understanding.

- **Popcorn/sight words!** Make a "popcorn word" of your own and find it in the books you are reading!
- **Review letter sounds!** Find letter objects around your home, letter shaped objects in nature and continue adding letters to your illustrations.
- Bake or cook together as a family! Choose one of the many recipes online or in a cookbook and bake or cook a special treat or meal to enjoy with your family.
- Do a science experiment! Follow along with a science experiment on YouTube, or test a theory of your own!
- PLAY! This is an important part of your everyday routine! Engage
 in different types of play that help you to explore your
 curiosities, experiment and have fun!
- Teach your child social responsibility. Practice proper hand washing, coughing or sneezing into their elbow and keeping a safe distance. Reinforce the importance of listening to our bodies and telling an adult if we don't feel well.
