New Business

Key Communicator Update:

CBE Enrolment Update as of October 2024:

- 143,000 students which is an increase of 5,000+ students and enough to fill 8+ elementary schools
- 40,000+ English as an Additional Language (EAL) Learners
- Schools are full 30 per cent of all schools are at/over capacity

July 2024 Funding Announcement:

- Government announced an additional \$125M in one-time funding to address increasing enrolment, rising operational costs, inflation
- CBE's share is about \$20M:
 - Majority of these dollars are being directed to classrooms to support teaching and learning
 - A portion to reduce operating pressures and optimize learning spaces *Adjust

Need for new schools, modernizations and modular classrooms

- 56% of CBE schools are over 50 years old
- Modernized environments can help CBE expand opportunities in CTS and STEM
- Modular classrooms provide some relief for full schools
- Learn more: 2025-28 Capital Plan

School Construction Accelerator Program

- Government recognized the need for more spaces
- Provincially:

•

- \$8.6B over three years (a \$6.5B increase)
- o 30 new schools/year for next three years
- o Fast-tracked approvals mid-year
- CBE did not receive any new approvals
- CBE has 13 new school projects that are siteready and 47 modular classrooms are being installed this school year
