## Principal's Report – Travis/Jackie

- Thank you to Parent Association for gaga ball pits and soccer field grass
- 32 staff at this point: ~22 teaching staff, 2 facilities staff, remainder: support staff
- Coaches found for all current sport seasons with the exception of volleyball still in need of 1 coach, role could be filled with a parent volunteer
- In order to ensure ongoing safety, front and back entrance doors are now secured with key cards
- Still waiting to get doors installed on the open area basement classrooms
- School development planning:
  - Emphasizing culture of belonging, authentic personalization and differentiation, mathematics, literacy and well-being
- School arrival process:
  - Continues to be an issue, reminders re safe drop offs continue to be in the weekly newsletter
  - We have a school resource officer this year
  - Parent suggestion Elbow Park School put out pylons to slow down traffic, principal is
    present during drop-off; Response: admin currently supervise indoor hallways, support
    staff available out front (bus attendance/supervision); pylons have been tried as has a
    CPS (Calgary Police Service) response (we are fortunate to have a School Resource
    Officer SRO, assigned to us from CPS).

- School configuration
  - o Class sizes addressed during System Leadership meeting today
  - Applications for additional funding based on current student numbers due at the end of September
  - o Applications will be submitted for KD, grade 6, and grade 8
  - o All students who have been overflowed have been in grades 6 & 8
  - o If funding not successful, one contingency plan being considered is multi-aging (i.e., split) classes for grades 5 & 6
  - Travis has signaled to our director that we do need to hire more staff than we can currently afford
- New Staff
  - o Mr. Doherty new band/music teacher
  - Ms. Schmidlin Grade 9
  - o Rebecca McDonald K & Grades 1-2
  - o Taryn Cameron Grades 3-4
  - o Consistent guest teacher: Joanne Nielsen (familiar face from last year)
- Fewer options available for Jr high (4 vs 6)
  - o There may be an opportunity for students to re-apply/prioritize for 2<sup>nd</sup> semester

    - Special assembly with guest speaker, an Oncologist, speaking about cancer and caner research
  - o Halloween Dance
- Quebec Trip will know more about NCLB (Oct-Nov meeting)
